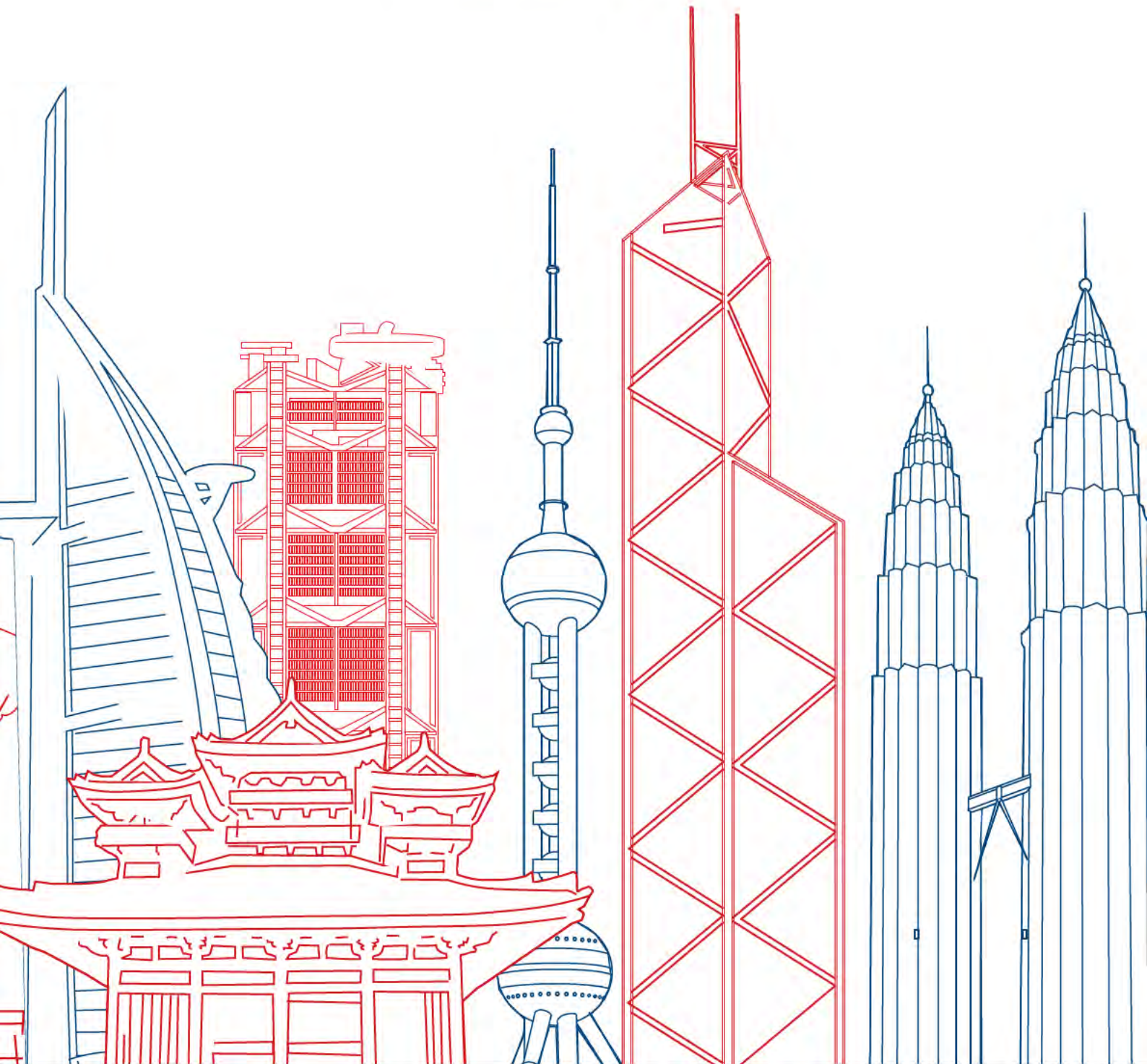

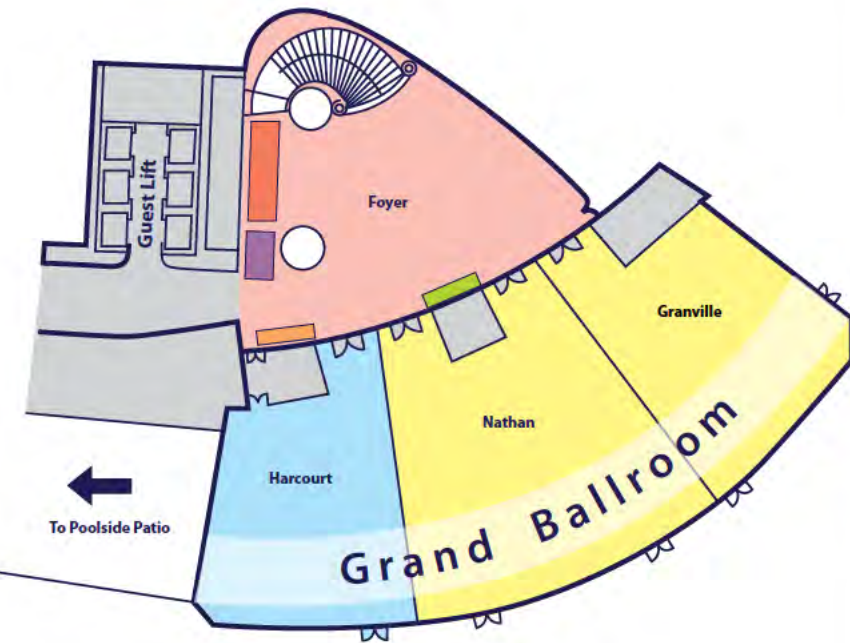

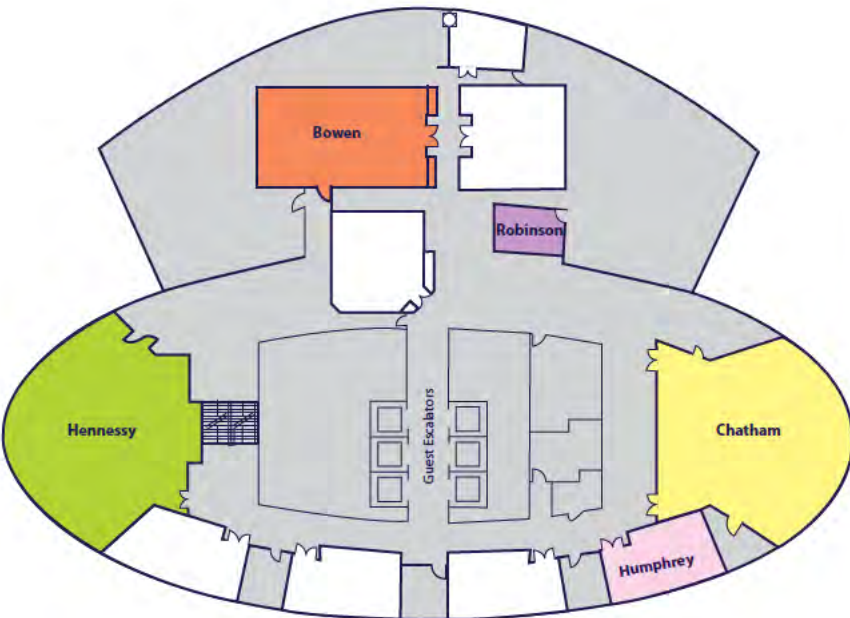

Asia-Global Dialogue, the Institute's annual flagship forum, is Asia's independent platform for thought leaders, business leaders and community leaders from Asia and around the world to engage in dialogue on the world's most fundamental and pressing issues, and what they mean for business and the global economy.

Over the next two days, a strong line-up of distinguished international speakers and over 400 participants in Hong Kong shall together explore a timely theme ***Towards a New Global Economy: Re-defining Asia's Role***. The intention is to map the positive role Asian business can play as the global economy re-balances to the East.

The Dialogue is structured around the four themes driving the Institute's research, namely, *Global Supply Chains*, *Asia's New Financial Architecture*, *The Evolving Growth Models - China and India*, and *Asia's Sustainable Development*.

Isher Ahluwalia

Chairperson, Board of Governors, Indian Council for Research on International Economic Relations

Isher Judge Ahluwalia is the Chairperson of the Board of Governors for the Indian Council for Research on International Economic Relations (ICRIER). Prior to this, she served as ICRIER's Director and Chief Executive.

She is the appointed chair of the High Powered Expert Committee on Urban Infrastructure of the Ministry of Urban Development. Dr Ahluwalia is also a member of the Government of India's National Manufacturing Competitiveness Council; is on the boards of a number of premier research institutes in India, and was Vice-Chairperson of the Punjab State Planning Board from 2005 to 2007.

Dr Ahluwalia, a former Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the International Food Policy Research Institute, was a member of the Eminent Persons Group of the Asian Development Bank, which submitted its report entitled Towards a New Asian Development Bank in a New Asia in 2008.

In 2009, Dr Ahluwalia received the Padma Bhushan award from the President of India for her services to the fields of education and literature. She received a BA in economics from Presidency College, Calcutta University, an MA in economics from the Delhi School of Economics, and a PhD in economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.



Liu Mingkang

**Distinguished Fellow, Fung Global Institute
Former Chairman, China Banking Regulatory Commission**

Liu Mingkang, as the Fung Global Institute's first Distinguished Fellow, provides strategic advice on research to its leadership.

He served as the first Chairman of the China Banking Regulatory Commission from 2003 to 2011 and was a member of the Monetary Policy Committee of the People's Bank of China. Previously, Mr Liu was Chairman and President of the Bank of China (2000 to 2003), Chairman of China Everbright Group (1999 to 2000), Deputy Governor of the People's Bank of China (1998 to 1999) and Deputy Governor of China Development Bank (1994 to 1998). Mr Liu was a member of the Financial Stability Board (FSB), Vice-Chairman of the Standing Committee on Supervisory and Regulatory Cooperation under the FSB, a member of the Governance Body of the Basel Committee on Banking Supervision and a Vice-Chairman of the International Institute of Finance.

He is a member of the 17th Central Committee of the Communist Party of China. He is also Vice-Chairman of the Committee for Economic Affairs of the National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference.

Mr Liu sits on the International Advisory Boards of the Guanghua Management School of Peking University and of the School of Economics and Management of Tsinghua University. He graduated in economics from Beijing University, and is Honorary Dean of the Lingnan (University) College of Sun Yat-sen University, in Guangzhou.



Tung Chee Hwa

**Founding Chairman, China-United States Exchange Foundation
Vice-Chairman, National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference**

Tung Chee Hwa is the Founding Chairman of the China-United States Exchange Foundation. He previously served as the first Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region from July 1997 to March 2005 and is currently Vice-Chairman of the National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference.

Mr Tung has served in a number of public and advisory positions, including as a member of the Executive Council of Hong Kong (1992 to 1996) and the Eighth National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference (1993 to 1996); Chairman of the Hong Kong/US Economic Cooperation Committee (1993 to 1996), and Chairman of the Council of the City University of Hong Kong (1995 to 1996).

Mr Tung has also had a distinguished career in the private sector as Chairman from 1979 to 1996 of Orient Overseas (International) Limited, a publicly-listed company in Hong Kong. Born in Shanghai, he studied in Hong Kong and the UK, graduating from the University of Liverpool with a BSc in marine engineering. He also received an Honorary Doctor of Law degree from the University of Liverpool; an Honorary Doctor of Social Sciences degree from the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology and an Honorary Doctor of Laws degree from the Chinese University of Hong Kong. Mr Tung is also a Senior Fellow of Harvard University Asia Center.



Paul Volcker

Former Chairman, Board of Governors, US Federal Reserve

Paul Volcker was the Chairman of the Federal Reserve under Presidents Jimmy Carter and Ronald Reagan from 1979 to 1987. He is widely credited with ending the high levels of inflation seen at the time. Additionally, he was the Chairman of the Economic Recovery Advisory Board under President Barack Obama from 2009 to 2011.

Mr Volcker's career began in 1952, when he joined the Federal Reserve Bank of New York as an economist. After stints both in the public service and the private sector, Mr Volcker returned to public service in 1969 as Under-Secretary of the Treasury for Monetary Affairs until 1974. He played an important role in the decisions leading to the US suspension of gold convertibility in 1971, which ended the Bretton Woods system. After leaving the US Treasury, he became President of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York from 1975 to 1979, and then Federal Reserve Board Chairman in 1979.

As Chairman of the Economic Recovery Advisory Board, he called for a breakup of the nation's largest banks, prohibiting deposit-taking institutions from engaging in riskier activities such as proprietary trading, private equity, and hedge fund investments. The so-called "Volcker Rule" was proposed to prohibit US banks from engaging in risky proprietary trades that do not benefit clients. With a number of exceptions, the rule's provisions are due to be implemented from July this year.





Rakesh Bhatia

Global Head of Trade and Supply Chain, HSBC

Rakesh Bhatia is HSBC's Global Head of Trade and Supply Chain. In this role, he is responsible for providing HSBC clients with trade services and supply chain solutions around the globe, a role he has undertaken since January 2011.

Prior to this, Mr Bhatia was CEO of HSBC in Indonesia, from 2007 to 2011. He was responsible for expanding HSBC's local network. He also contributed substantially to the Group's successful acquisition of a controlling stake in Bank Ekonomi in Indonesia, which nearly doubled HSBC's presence in this emerging market to over 200 outlets in 26 cities, the largest HSBC branch network in Asia outside Hong Kong.

Since joining HSBC in 1987, Mr Bhatia has worked in India, Bahrain, the UK, Hong Kong, Singapore and Indonesia, with roles encompassing corporate and investment banking, personal financial services and Group training.

Mr Bhatia received his Bachelor's (Hons) degree in commerce from Shri Ram College of Commerce in Delhi, and MBA from the Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad (IIMA).



Andrew Brandler

Chief Executive Officer, CLP Holdings Limited

Andrew Brandler joined CLP as the Group's CEO in 2000 and has since developed CLP as a leading investor-owned power business in Asia with a strong presence in Hong Kong, the Chinese mainland, India, Australia and Southeast Asia.

Mr Brandler has had an extensive career as a banker in the energy and utility sector in North America, Europe and Asia. His experience covers power sector deregulation in the USA in the 1980s and the UK electricity industry privatisation and deregulation in the 1990s.

Chairman of The Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce from 2008 to 2010, Mr Brandler currently serves on a number of public and advisory bodies in Hong Kong.

He holds an MA from University of Cambridge, an MBA from Harvard Business School, and is a member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.
